

City Council Adopted Growth Management Policies

1. Support the existing Eugene Urban Growth Boundary by taking actions to increase density and use existing vacant land and under-used land within the boundary more efficiently.
2. Encourage in-fill, mixed-use, redevelopment, and higher density development.
3. Encourage a mix of businesses and residential uses downtown using incentives and zoning.
4. Improve the appearance of buildings and landscapes.
5. Work cooperatively with Metro area partners (Springfield and Lane County) and other nearby cities to avoid urban sprawl and preserve the rural character in areas outside the urban growth boundaries.
6. Increase density of new housing development while maintaining the character and livability of individual neighborhoods.
7. Provide for a greater variety of housing types.

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8. Promote construction of affordable housing.
9. Mitigate the impacts of new and/or higher density housing, in-fill, and redevelopment on neighborhoods through design standards, open space and housing maintenance programs, and continuing historic preservation and neighborhood planning programs.
10. Encourage the creation of transportation-efficient land use patterns and implementation of nodal development concepts.
11. Increase the use of alternative modes of transportation by improving the capacity, design, safety, and convenience of the transit, bicycle, and pedestrian transportation systems.
12. Encourage alternatives to the use of single-occupant vehicles through demand management techniques.
13. Focus future street improvements on relieving pressure on the City's most congested roadways and intersections to maintain an acceptable level of mobility for all modes of transportation.

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14. Development shall be required to pay the full cost of extending infrastructure.
15. Target publicly-financed infrastructure extensions to support development for higher densities, in-fill, mixed uses, and nodal development.
16. Focus efforts to diversify the local economy and provide family-wage jobs principally by supporting local and environmentally-sensitive businesses. Direct available financial and regulatory incentives to support these efforts.
17. Protect and improve air and water quality and protect natural areas of good habitat value through a variety of means such as better enforcement of existing regulations, new or revised regulations, or other practices.
18. Increase the amount and variety of parks and open spaces.
19. Expand City efforts to achieve community-based policing.
